



Pandemic Preparedness



At our recent Meritcare Faith Community the speaker was Mary Jagim, RN, Emergency Preparedness Consultant of Meritcare She about "Pandemic Health System. spoke Influenza Preparedness" and how we in the community need to be aware of this and how to prepare for it, should it happen. The immediate concern is the Avian Influenza (Bird Flu). It refers to a large group of different influenza viruses that primarily affect birds. Most of these viruses do not effect humans, however some of these viruses can infect humans and cause significant illness. Pandemic influenza often develops when an animal or bird virus mixes with a human virus to form a new virus. We are used to the seasonal influenza which happens every year, caused by a virus and usually is not serious and only affects about 10% of the people. Where as pandemic flu could affect 35% of the people and could result in a high death rate.

Planning for the pandemic is very challenging as there is so much that won't be known until it actually happens and from past experience it will cause significant disruption to the social economic, normal activities and resources in our community. At the

present the bird flu is in other countries of the world but it will only be a matter of time before it will affect the United States. They know from the past three influenza pandemics of the 20th Century (Spanish Flu, Asian Flu, and the Hong Kong Flu) the impact that it could have.

She stressed the importance of preparing and how all community-based organizations should take precautions before an influenza pandemic arrives in the United States and how we can minimize the spread of the virus. Meritcare has done extensive studies and has a list of resources that are available which will be posted at the church, along with a Faith Based & Community Organizations Pandemic Influenza Preparedness Checklist.
