



So you BECOME 21, TURN 30, PUSH 40, REACH 50, and MAKE it to 60.


You've built up so much speed that you HIT 70! After that its a day-by-day thing, you HIT Wednesday!

It was something to see those old Vets – some were in their 90's – come off the plane. Everyone was waving flags, etc. See you at the airport on September 8th!
