#### **Recipe Corner**

#### **Gingersnap Bars**

3/4 cup butter 1/2 teaspoon ginger

2 cups flour ½ teaspoon salt

1 cup sugar ½ cup molasses

2 teaspoons baking soda 1 egg

1 teaspoon lemon juice 2 tablespoons sugar

Melt butter in a saucepan, cool 5 minutes. Add remaining ingredients except 2 tablespoons sugar.

Spread in a greased 10" X 15" X 1" jelly roll pan (batter will be very thick). Sprinkle with 2 tablespoons sugar.

Bake at 350 degrees for about 10 minutes. DO NOT

OVERBAKE! Bars are done if a slight imprint is left when you press with your finger. Cool 5 minutes, cut into bars.

Note: I skipped the sugar on top and made a powdered sugar frosting instead.
