




<u>Quilting</u>

Recipe Corner

Butterscotch Cheesecake Bars

- 1-12oz. package butterscotch chips
- 1/3 cup butter or margarine
- 2 cups crushed graham crackers
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- 1-6 oz. package cream cheese
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 egg

Mix the crushed graham crackers and nuts together. Divide in $\frac{1}{2}$. Melt the butterscotch chips in the microwave.

Stir in ½ of the crumb/nut mixture and press into a 9 X 13 pan.


Beat the cream cheese until it is fluffy, add the vanilla, milk and egg.

Pour over crumb/nut mix, spread evenly.

Sprinkle remaining crumb/not mixture on top.

Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

Minnesota Sesquicentennial Norwegian Statehood Pioneer Project

Minnesota became a state on May 11, 1858. As part of the year-long celebration of the state's 150th anniversary, the Norwegian Statehood Pioneer Project is collecting information about and recognizing the Norwegians who lived in the state when Minnesota was born.

Some of Concordia's earliest members were Norwegian Statehood Pioneers. Although the Buffalo River Settlement dates to only 1870, many of its settlers came from Houston County in southeastern Minnesota, where they had lived since the early

1850's. There is an interesting article written by Jim Skree in the history section of our website about some of these ancestors:

Participating organizations will publish articles about Norwegian settlements in Minnesota in the 1850's throughout the year. The project is accepting applications for recognition of ancestors who were statehood pioneers. Descendant/applicants will receive a plaque in the shape of Minnesota with the name of their Statehood Pioneer inscribed on it. Biographies and photos that are submitted will be published in a book about Norwegian pioneers. There will be a celebration in Rochester in October, 2008.

There are more Minnesotans that claim Norwegian ancestry than in any other state in the union. Whether you read the newsletter articles, apply for recognition, attend the October celebration, or purchase the Heritage Book, the Norwegian Statehood Pioneer Project offers many opportunities to celebrate both your Minnesota roots and your pride in your Norwegian heritage.
