## **Words from Pastor Gretchen**

Dear Friends in Christ,

In July, we heard the Gospel lessons about sowing seeds. And I commend you for you are doing just

that! The seeds of a ministry of hospitality which you are sowing are flourishing. Thanks to all for the hospitality you offered in the wonderful ice cream social in July. What joy! How exciting!

On the first Sunday in August, the Gospel lesson calls us to put our resources into God's hands and to trust that God will use them for good.

The gospel lesson for August 2<sup>nd</sup> from Matthew 14 states:

<sup>13</sup> Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. <sup>14</sup> When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. <sup>15</sup>When it was evening, the disciples came

to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves." <sup>16</sup>Jesus said to them, "They need not go away, you give them something to eat." <sup>17</sup>They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish." <sup>18</sup>And he said, "Bring them here to me." <sup>19</sup>Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. <sup>20</sup>And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. <sup>21</sup>And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.







## **Concordia Lutheran Church**

## 6470 80<sup>th</sup> Avenue N., about 10 miles northwest of Glyndon, Minn.

According to history published in a 1980 church directory, Concordia Lutheran Church came to be when two congregations, Our Savior's and Moland, merged in late 1891.

The congregations chose the name Concordia, which, according to the directory means "harmony." And, if you want to trace the meaning of the word way back, Concordia was a Roman goddess having to do with agreement and harmony.

**Pronunciation**: Say "con" (as in "to take advantage of" but with a little more of a "u" sound) plus "cord" and "dia" as in the Spanish word for "day." Emphasis is on "cord."
