Lenten Reflections

When you think of unlucky numbers you might well think of the number 13. Perhaps the origins of this superstition date back to Judas, Jesus' 13th disciple. However, if

one were to try to guess the unluckiest number of both the Old and New Testaments, the number 40 would be a pretty safe guess.

The phrase "40 days and 40 nights" would register as a meaningful one in probably most Americans' minds. Most likely people would think of the duration of the great flood in Genesis which wiped out nearly all human life. Others would be led to think of the 40 years of wilderness wanderings of the people of Israel following Moses, again

a time in which there were very few survivors. Others may think of the duration of Jesus' stay in the wilderness at the beginning of his ministry when he was confronted with the powers of death and evil. Few would contemplate that Lent lasts 40 days. We sometimes hear that Jesus went to the cross so we would not have to, or that Jesus submitted to death so that we would need to. The Apostle Paul has a different notion, however. He was of the opinion that Jesus did not go to the cross instead of us (literally "in our stead or place") but that he went before us and as his disciples we follow in his footsteps. Paul said that baptism was a participation with Christ in death and resurrection. Perhaps the best reason Lent is 40 days is that we again walk through death with Jesus to our own cross, where again the old Adam/Eve are crucified and the new individual is raised from the dead. At its best Lent is a reenactment of what occurred for the first time in our baptism and what, according to Martin Luther, needs to happen daily to us as we remember our baptism into Christ's death and resurrection.

As we face the prospects of a very real and very threatening flood, how are you going to ponder what this season of Lent, soon to be followed by Easter, means to you. God bless you this season of 40 days and nights. May the joy and power of resurrection be all the more real to you as you walk behind Jesus in his pilgrimage to the cross and beyond.


You'll spend two nights in a comfortable hotel and enjoy five delicious meals from Friday at 7:00 pm to Sunday at 5:00 pm.
