In the Gospels, the 12 disciples are renown for their incapacity to comprehend not only Jesus' messages but, more tragically, their inability to truly understand who Jesus was. One of the few epiphanies is found in Matthew 16 where Jesus asks the generic question, "Who do people say that I am." The disciples volunteer



the information with all the predictable responses: a great teacher, a prophet etc. Suddenly Jesus trains a spotlight on them and asks the question, "Who do you say that I am?" This is a loaded question, not distant from a man or woman asking their spouse if a particular article of clothing makes them look fat. However, into this mix, the ever impulsive Peter wades in at his peril. However, it appears that finally he gets it right when he says that Jesus is the Messiah the Son of God. To which Jesus says that Peter derived this insight not from his cleverness, not from his being well read but as a direct revelation from God. In other words, the typically clueless Peter gets no personal credit even when he provides the right answer. Jesus, while affirming the amazing accuracy of Peter's testimony, says that this was not due to anything Peter brought to the event but was provided by divine intervention.

While this provides no reason for Peter to brag, it does provide you and me the opportunity to acknowledge the possibility that we might be connected to the events of the ongoing events of God's intervention for good into the events of human history. Much has been said about the unforeseen impact of a pebble being cast into a still lake, the ripples can carry for significant distances. A small change of events a thousand years ago could have had massive repercussions in modern life.

You and I have been recruited into God's Kingdom in our baptisms. We are his people who exist primarily to be His agents for good in a world gone bad. Whether we know it or not, God not only counts on us but, unbeknownst to us, is working his will for good in the world today. Our bringing a hot dish to a grieving widow, our saying a prayer for a struggling neighbor, our writing out a check for the furtherance of God's mission are but a brief sampling of ways God has and will continue to use ordinary folks like you and me for his greater purpose.

May God bless you as we continue to live our lives for Him,

Virgil Jegtvig, age 71, of rural Glyndon, MN, passed away on Monday, August 4, 2014, at home with





Rites Thursday for N. J. Hanson

Clay County Resident since 1895 died at Morken farm Monday.

Funeral Services for Nels Jacob Hanson, 60, Morken Township farmer and resident of Clay County since 1895, will be held Thursday at 1 p.m. at the Wright chapel and at 2 p.m. in Concordia Lutheran Church. The body will be in state Wednesday afternoon and evening in the Wright Chapel.

Mr. Hanson died of heart disease at his home Monday. He had been ill several months. Born October 28, 1871, in Norway, Mr. Hanson came almost directly to Clay County when he emigrated

from Norway and worked several years as a farm laborer before securing his own land. His marriage to Laura Svenkeson took place in Concordia Lutheran Church July 9, 1910. A member of Concordia Church, he also was on the Riverside school district board for 12 years, acting as chairman.

Surviving are Mrs. Hanson, four sons, Arthur, Walter, and Norman, all at home; Lawrence, Duluth; two sisters, Mrs. Emma Pherson, Norway, and Mrs. Jennie Hoyem, Duluth, and two brothers, Albert and Huldur, Norway.
