The day of Thanksgiving is not a traditional festival of the church year. This is because its origins have no direct connection to the early

church (such as Christmas, Easter or Pentecost). Most Americans believe that its origins date back to the time of the Pilgrims, however, its origins date back to the Old World. The main insight is that it is a time of intentional/national expression of gratitude for God's blessing to His people. Prayers of thanks and special thanksgiving ceremonies are common among almost all religions after harvests and at other times. The Thanksgiving holiday's history in North America is rooted in English traditions dating from the Protestant Reformation. It also has aspects of a harvest festival, even though the harvest in New England occurs well before the late-November date on which the modern Thanksgiving holiday is celebrated.

In the English tradition, days of thanksgiving and special thanksgiving religious services became important during the English Reformation in the reign of Henry VIII and in reaction to the large number of religious holidays on the Catholic calendar. Before 1536 there were 95 Church holidays, plus 52 Sundays, when people were required to attend church and forego work and sometimes pay for expensive celebrations. The 1536 reforms reduced the number of Church holidays to 27, but some Puritans wished to completely eliminate all Church holidays, including Christmas and Easter. The holidays were to be replaced by specially called Days of Fasting or Days of Thanksgiving, in response to events that the Puritans viewed as acts of special providence. Unexpected disasters or threats of judgment from on high called for Days of Fasting. Special blessings, viewed as coming from God, called for Days of Thanksgiving. For example, Days of Fasting were called on account of drought in 1611, floods in 1613, and plagues in 1604 and 1622. Days of Thanksgiving were called following the victory over the Spanish Armada in 1588 and following the deliverance of Queen Anne in 1705. An unusual annual Day of Thanksgiving began in 1606 following the failure of the Gunpowder Plot in 1605 and developed into Guy Fawkes Day.



Recipe of the Month Norwegian Stuffed Eggs

An alternative to deviled eggs for your holiday entertaining

Ingredients

- 8 hard-boiled eggs, peeled
- ¹/₄ cup chopped smoked salmon
- 1 TB butter
- 1 TB sour cream
- 3 TB grated Swiss cheese
- ½ tsp dill
- $1/_2$ teaspoon salt

16 small slices of green pepper and 16 slices of black olive

Directions

- Slice eggs in two and remove yokes. Set white 'shells' aside.
- In a medium-sized bowl, mash the egg yokes. Add the salmon, sour cream, butter, cheese, and dill and mix thoroughly.
- Stuff egg white shells
- Garnish with a small slice of green pepper and a slice of black olive

On Veterans' Day: A Story of Service

When I was 13 or so, my father and I sat with my grandfather in his den. I asked him about a small painting of a rocky peak capped with snow he had made with strokes of blue, gray and white years ago.

My grandfather looked at it for a moment. He said, "I remember this kid, a private. We were being shelled by artillery, but they were shooting too high. We could hear the rounds pass just over our heads and hit the mountain somewhere behind us. It shook the ground. There was this kid crouched across from me. As the rounds went over, I could see the color leave his face, and when they exploded behind us I could see it come back. Up there on that mountain. That kid's face, dying and coming back to life, over and over. I'll never forget it."

I learned later that he had made the painting while he recovered from his wounds in a hospital at the end of the war. I looked at my father, who was leaning so far forward I thought he might fall out of his chair. His eyes were wide and, for a moment he looked younger than I. I didn't realize he'd been waiting since 1945 for a single story about the war from his father. My grandfather never told another.

On Memorial Day we remember veterans we have lost, but Veterans Day is to celebrate those who live. There should be no difference between those of us who have seen combat and those who volunteered in peacetime, activeduty members and reservists, 20 year careers and two year enlistments. These are all Americans who, for a time, invested their lives in service to our nation and have become direct participants in securing our independence.

There are 22 million veterans living in America today, civilians again, mowing their lawns and waiting in lines. We mention sacrifice on days like this, but sacrifice isn't the thing a veteran will recall. In the six years since I left the Marines, what strikes me is a veteran's enduring attachment to their unit, their clear memory of places and comrades, the stunning drama of their missions or unique situational comedy of their labors.

What if today – instead of thanking a veteran for their service and then passing by – you ask them for a story? We all have one to tell...



Thanksgiving Day brings to mind the blessings in our lives that usually go unnoticed: a home that surrounds us with comfort and protection; delicious food, for pleasure in both eating and sharing; clothes to snuggle up in, books and good entertainment to expand our minds; and freedom to worship our God. Most of all we are thankful for our family and friends, those treasured people who make our lives extra special. ~Joanna Fuchs
