This Lenten season, Concordia will be using a drama series entitled, "The People vs. Judas Iscariot." by Pastor Wm. Clayton McCord. It is a fictional play that depicts the punishment phase of Judas' trial. Judas' guilt is without doubt according to the biblical witness:

"... He went away and conferred with the chief priests and officers of the temple police about how he might betray Jesus to them. They were greatly pleased and agreed to give Judas money. So he consented and began to look for an opportunity to betray Jesus to them..." Luke 22:3-6. Also: "While he was still speaking, suddenly a crowd came, and the one called Judas, one of the twelve was leading them. He approached Jesus to kiss him, but Jesus said to him, 'Judas, is it with a kiss that you are betraying the Son of Man?" Luke 22:47-48.

But there is ambiguity as well. We read in scripture how Satan entered Judas. What might be the implications of this for Judas' true guilt? Could a defense attorney offer the plea of innocent due to demonic possession? Another passage speaks of how Judas was destined to betray Jesus. What might this mean for his innocence or guilt? In this drama we will hear about Judas from the people most familiar with him: Peter, John, Mary Magdalene, and others. These characters will be played by members of our congregation. Come and be a part of this drama every Wed evening during Lent preceded by a simple meal starting at 5:00.

Volunteers were very helpful in our first (and future) Lenten dramas and the expressions of all those who volunteer with many different areas of work at Concordia are so helpful (note Gordon's words at the annual meeting especially). I would like to echo these many expressions of gratitude for ALL our volunteers but given that this is a newsletter I'd like to express gratitude to Sylvia, Walter and Alene for their part in our printed word in the newsletter and our communication on the internet. Recipe of the Month Zesty Chicken Corn Chowder

Serves 4



Ingredients

2 TB butter or olive oil

1 lb. diced chicken breast

1 cup onions

1 tsp cumin

1 can cream of chicken soup

1 cup frozen whole kernel corn

½ cup water

1 can Ro-Tel Diced Tomatoes & Green Chilis Or

1 10 oz. can diced tomatoes

½ green pepper, finely chopped

1 clove of garlic, finely chopped

2 TB chili powder

3 tsp Cayenne pepper

Directions

- Preheat large skillet on medium. Add butter or olive oil, then add chicken and onion. Cook until chicken is no longer pink and onions are transparent.
- Add cumin and cook for 1 minute.
- Add other ingredients and mix well.
- Increase heat to high and bring to a boil.
- Reduce heat to low, cook for 12-18 minutes.

Pretzels for Lent?

In the early Christian church, fasting during Lent was taken very seriously. Only an evening meal was to be prepared, and couldn't contain



meat or animal products – including dairy and eggs. Small snacks were allowed during the day, but the same rules applied.

According to pretzel maker Snyders of Hanover, a young monk in the early 600s in Italy was preparing a Lenten bread of water, flour and salt. To remind his fellow monks that Lent was a time of prayer, he rolled the dough in strips and shaped each in the form of crossed arms, like the prayer position of folding ones arms over each other on the chest. These were baked in the oven like the big soft pretzels popular today.

In the late 1500s the Ottoman Turks besieged Vienna Austria, and tried to tunnel into the city. In the basement of the monastery, monks were baking pretzels. They heard the noise, alerted the army, and saved the city!


Mrs. Morken Rites to be on Tuesday
