It has been inspiring to worship Wednesday evenings during this season of Lent. Many people have participated as readers in a dramatic reading pertaining to the fictional trial of Judas. The script drew heavily on scriptural passages but also placed the trial in a

setting similar to a modern court room, with witnesses who testified under oath in front of a judge with cross examination done by a prosecutor and defense attorney. Needing several participants there was no way that I as a pastor could re-enact this alone, hence the need for volunteers. Thankfully, volunteers were forthcoming, perhaps an advantage of the long passed concept of Confirmation including "reading for the minister" which often involved speaking in front of the congregation. Regardless of the causes for an abundant supply of volunteers, the effect was edifying with numerous individuals stating that this kind of drama should be done more often (easily accomplished as we have not had such an event since my arrival several years ago).

One of the interesting insights into the issue of lay people's involvement in leading worship is the word "liturgy". In biblical Greek the word means: "the work of the people." Luther frequently spoke of the "priesthood of all believers." It is right and proper for non-clergy to be involved in leading worship. The overwhelmingly positive reception of the Lenten series is further evidence of the merits of lay involvement in leading worship.

Thanks to all who were integral to the successful and edifying Lenten series. Now we move from Lent to Easter. I invited you to worship at Concordia during this season of hope, light and new life. Lord knows we need to be uplifted by the message that the resurrection is not just relevant to Jesus Christ but to us not only for the life to come but for every day of our lives here on earth.

Obituary: Jesus of Nazareth (6 BC - 27 AD)

Jesus, son of Mary and Joseph (or so people thought) was born in Bethlehem of Judea. At about the age of two he moved with his family to

Egypt. At the age of four, he moved to Nazareth in Galilee. Thus he was known the rest of his life as the Nazarene. He grew in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and men. His young adult years were spent applying himself to the carpenter trade.

At age thirty he was baptized and began a public ministry which progressed from Galilee into all of Judea. His ministry attracted large crowds who came to hear him preach and to be healed. The people who gathered were witness to many miracles.

After three years his ministry came to an abrupt end when he was accused of crimes against the state, claiming to be something others said he was not. Jesus loved God and us. On a Friday afternoon he humbled himself and became obedient even to death, death upon the cross. He had attained the age of 33 years.

Jesus is survived by his mother Mary; brothers James, Joseph, Simon and Judas; and a number of sisters. He was preceded in death by his earthly father Joseph.

Recipe of the Month Chive and Honey Biscuits

Makes 12



Ingredients

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 4 tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp salt
- ¹/₄ cup chopped fresh chives
- ½ cup milk
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup warmed honey

Directions

- Preheat oven to 425.
- In a mixing bowl blend together dry ingredients.
- Warm honey for about 20 seconds in microwave.
- In a second bowl, mix milk, mayonnaise and honey.
- Combine contents of both bowls and mix well.
- Roll on floured surface to about ³/₄ thickness.
- Use a biscuit cutter to cut into rounds and place on baking sheet
- Cook 10-12 minutes until golden brown.



Easter Bunnies & Eggs

Birds laying eggs in new nests is an ancient and universal symbol of spring. In the Eastern Church, the faithful

abstained from eggs during Lent, so on Easter eggs were decorated to celebrate their return to the diet.

The fertility goddess Eostra was worshipped in pagan Germany, with her celebration on the vernal equinox. Rabbits were an especially important symbol; they produce large litters in the spring and represent fertility and springtime.

German Lutherans are believed to have adopted the Easter Rabbit as a Christian tradition by the 1600s, with hares (*ostschter haws*) bringing eggs to good children at Easter. They brought the practice to America in the 18th century.
