Recipe of the Month

Jean's Punch

- 2 packages Kool-Aid
- 2 quarts water
- 1 46 oz. can pineapple juice
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 quart ginger ale
- 8 scoops sherbet

Directions

From the Moorhead Daily News August 5, 1929 Many Join Clay County Potato Tour New Thortvedt Digger



The principal attraction at the Goodwin Thortvedt farm was a two-row digger invented by Mr. Thortvedt and tried out last fall. This machine is said to work satisfactorily under practically any conditions of soil and weather, digging two rows at once and placing the potatoes in a single row for easy gathering. By digging two rows at once it saves the labor of one man and the use of one tractor.

Levi Thortvedt, Goodwin's father, showed the new machine and explained its use. In 1923 Thortvedts invented the first single row machine which they also manufacture and sell. To date about 50 have been sold. Many more orders will be filled this year. The two-row digger, Mr. Thortvedt stated, will dig as much as 30 pickers can gather in fields where the yield will go 150 bushels per acre.



National Honey Bee Day is August 22

Did You Know.....

✓ Some estimates range from 50-80% of

the world's food supply being directly or indirectly affected by honey bee pollination. Whether it's pollination of apples, or pollination of the seeds used to produce grain for livestock, the food chain is linked to honey bees. The world's production of food is dependent on pollination provided by bees. Ever see a lopsided apple or pumpkin? That is a sign of improper - or a lack of pollination. Without the bee, many things in nature would be "lopsided."

✓ Bees do much more than help feed the world. By pollinating plants, they help create both food and shelter for wildlife. Pollinated plants help prevent soil erosion and also store carbon.

- ✓ The importance of bees has been recognized for a long time. Bees have been used in farming activities as far back as 4500 years.
- ✓ Einstein did NOT say the world would end in four years without bees. However, we certainly would have to change farming practices if that happened. Since 2006, over 10 million hives have been lost to 'colony collapse disorder.' Experts believe at least some of this extreme die-off is due to chemicals and climate change, but that doesn't seem to explain the whole problem. Exactly why bees are dying in such large numbers all over the country remains a mystery.
- ✓ Bees and bee products have been used in many areas of health. From bee sting apitherapy for arthritis to antibiotic treatment with honey for burn victims. Studies have shown that relief of a sore throat is higher with honey than most over the counter medicines available. Ongoing research suggests honey's antibacterial and antiviral properties could be used in many ways, perhaps even including cancer treatments
- ✓ Bees provide products that are used in the horse industry such as hoof salves and other medicines. Honey can be used as an embalming fluid. In some places honey has even served as money!
- ✓ The Minnesota DNR has identified over 350 native bee species in the state. In addition to the famous honey bees, there are 20 different kinds of fuzzy bumblebees, tiny carpenter bees (about the size of a grain of rice), yellow-faced bees, bright green bees, and black and white bees, to name just a few.
- ✓ We think of bees as living in hives, but over 70 percent of the bees in Minnesota live underground!
