Cora Amanda (Hatledal) Frederick (1915-2015)

Cora Hatledal Frederick lived on a farm just south of the church when the 1931 tornado struck. Her brother Melvin was killed and the family relocated to Hawley. She was confirmed at Concordia in 1929. Cora's

parents and brother are buried at Concordia. Her son Leslie in the letter accompanying the family's donations said, "She enjoyed receiving the newsletter and recalling her roots."

Cora passed peacefully at home with her sons Ernie and Garry and daughter-in-law Jei by her side. She was the second of four children born to Andrew and Clara (Ingebretsen) Hatledal. She completed 8th grade at Riverside School and was needed immediately to help on the farm. After both her father dying in 1930 and her brother dying in 1931 by her side during the tornado, she stepped up out of necessity to do the man's work on the farm until her younger brothers Raymond and Waldo grew strong enough to take over.

Then she worked away from the farm so that she could help keep the farm going by sending all possible money to her mother, working first in Moorhead and then in the middle of World War II in Seattle.

The mid-40s were an exuberant time for Cora. She met Al Frederick, a handsome young sailor, who after being discharged from the Navy on the East coast came back to her. They married in 1946. 4 sons – Garry, Les, Ernie and Jimmy – were born during the next 10 years. Cora found herself working with children with special needs with the Seattle school district until she retired in 1983.

Her Minnesota grit and friendliness showed itself in whatever she did – the kids she taught, the kids she raised, in the few dollars she had that stretched to make do. Life with her was grounded in reaching out to help others. The payback came in her dear grandchildren around whom she glowed even brighter.

In 1998, after living in the same house for 51 years, she moved to an apartment to be closer to her sons and grandchildren. In 2009, osteoporosis caused a broken femur and Cora moved into Jie's adult family home where Jie cared for her like her own mother. She will be greatly missed by her sons Garry (Mary) and son Todd; Les (Nancy), Amy and Laura; Ernie and children Brian and Melissa; Ernie's wife Jie Zhang and their son Tianyi Ma. Cora was preceded in death by her husband Al, son Jimmy, her brothers and sister-in-law Margaret.

Services were held at Northlake Lutheran Church, Kenmore WA on November 1, 2015.

The family expresses special appreciation to her caregivers Jie Zhang and Ara Sallano and to the Group Health Home Care and Hospice teams.

February 13, 1938 – Page Three "Amateur Show Successful"

The amateur show, pie social and boxing match staged in the West school on Saturday night was an outstanding success.

On the amateur program were the following: "Morken Sod Busters" group of singing girls; Lola Kragnes, accordion solo; Fred Hurner, guitar; Lorraine Espeland, recitation; Henry Skolness and Herbert Dahl, comedy accordion and guitar selection; Erwin, Orville, and Donald Hurner, vocal trio; Bernice and Esther Stine, vocal duet with ukulele accompaniment; Annie Brantner, vocal solo; Melvin Kragnes, accordion; Walter Engesather, recitation; Ethel Espeland, reading.

The boxing match was staged by Nukky Larson as "Lay Em Out" Larson and Bill Boulton as "Wild Bill Hazelstrom." It went four rounds as was judged a draw. Alger Larson was Boulton's second and Harry Mattson was Larson's second. C. U. Brantner, county commissioner for Georgetown, was referee

and Joe Brantner announced the fight. Clarence Mattson and Johnnie Wilcutt were timekeepers.

Erwin, Orville, and Donald Hurner were awarded first prize. The boxers took second, and Lorraine Espeland, third. Joe Brantner announced the amateur numbers. Valentines were distributed after the acts, followed by the pie social and dancing. Melvin Kragnes, Henry Skolness and Herbert Dahl furnished the music.

February 2, 1931 – Page One Lucille Kragnes Wins County Spelling Contest

Scoring a high grade of 99 percent, Lucille Kragnes, 14 year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ben Kragnes won the county spelling contest on Saturday and will represent Clay County in Crookston on February 14.

One common but catchy word kept Lucille from gaining a perfect score. It was the word "Eighth."

She safely surmounted such fierce obstacles as cellulose, ptomaine, naptha, liquefy, silhouette, erysipias, and rendezvous, only to be caught with an apparent common word. Her teacher is Miss Marie Mickelson.
