From Pastor Bruce



Advent is countercultural. The definition of countercultural is simply an act, belief or lifestyle that goes against the norms from of the dominant culture.

One might say that Advent was countercultural from the beginning. Here are some examples: God chose

a young unwed mother to bear his Son. Joseph did not reject (in effect, divorce) his pregnant betrothed, which was the norm of his time. The Son of God was born in squalor and grew up in poverty.

Advent is the season of the church year that is largely ignored by western society. The themes of Christmas (albeit increasing secular) are trotted into malls now even before Halloween as a way to increase sales. Many businesses will say that the weeks leading up to Christmas are the most profitable of the year and that it is essential to the bottom line to leverage consumers into unleashing their wallets. The themes of color, light, happiness embodied in a well-fed Santa Claus has served businesses well. It make sense that the earlier that Christmas is introduced the better the bottom line.

Most of you, readers of this newsletter, have long bemoaned the "commercialization of Christmas" in aversion to what I have mentioned. However, in many ways even we as Christians have fallen prey to these societal trends. I am not suggesting that we put up our Christmas trees as late as Christmas Eve, as many of our

ancestors did, but is there a way that we can honor the themes of Advent: anticipation, waiting, watching, unfulfilled longing? We who have the financial wherewithall to satiate our every desire immediately, thanks to Ebay, Amazon etc., must find ways to recapture the meaning of Advent if we hope to maintain the true meaning of Christmas.

Might we tithe on the time we spend shopping with time spent reading the great Advent texts? Even if we were to commit to spending not even 10% but 1% of the time we spend preparing materially for Christmas to preparing spiritually for Christmas by reading the rich and life giving Advent passages, such as those found in Isaiah? If we do, we will have the opportunity of truly appreciating the richness of Advent, the benefits of "waiting for it" and in turn we will be afforded a very real opportunity to thereby put the Christ back into Christmas, as we will have a deeper appreciation for the coming of the Christ child when the season of Christmas finally comes. In the meantime we join in the Advent prayer of anticipation and hope: "Oh Come oh Come Immanuel."

May your Christmas be rich and meaningful as you live in the season of anticipation, the season of Advent.





FATTIGMAND

Ingredients

- 3 egg yolks
- 3 Tablespoons cream
- 3 Tablespoons sugar
- 1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon cardamom
- 1 1/4 1 1/2 cups flour

Powdered sugar



Directions

- Mix until just blended, do not over mix
- Wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate for 2-3 hours (until well chilled)
- Roll out ½ of dough at a time (keep the rest refrigerated) to about 1/16" thick
- Cut into diamond shape with a slit down the middle
- Fry for 1.5 minutes in lard, flipping once.
- Rest on paper towel and sprinkle with powdered sugar
