In last month's newsletter I made

reference to the challenges faced by farmers in our area due to adverse weather and depressed prices. In mid Oct our Bill Tesch, our new bishop, sent out a message of encouragement. He is not just giving a speech about positive thinking it is much deeper than that. He is drawing on the ancient wisdom drawn from our faith



traditions dating back to well before the time of Christ. Often times when we experience great adversity we can isolate ourselves from our brothers and sisters in Christ and also separate ourselves from one of the greatest sources of mental and spiritual strength, scripture. Christians have found consolation in Christian fellowship for centuries. By engaging the Bible we tap into the experiences of believers over the millenia that have struggled with the issue of suffering as it pertains to God and God's people. Pastor Tesch alludes to one of the greatest resources we can draw on during difficult times, the book of Psalms. One of the most haunting is Psalm 22, which begins with the words "My God my God why have you forsaken me?" These words were used in worship a thousand years before Jesus quotes them from the cross. The good thing for us is that Jesus utilizes these words and uses them at the very end of his experience of not just physical but spiritual suffering. Ultimately we find the greatest encouragement in Christ on the cross. It is in this that we find God's response to our suffering knowing that He "gets it" and that through the resurrection he shows us that there is hope beyond our suffering. In the meantime we know that we have a companion, one who walks through even the darkest valleys with us. In large part this is what we are up to every Sunday morning as we do what believers have done for thousands of years drawing upon the consolation of God's people who support each other during times of joy and times of adversity.



# Sally Horpedahl 1934-2019



Sally Anne (Haugen) Horpedahl, 85, of Dilworth, MN, passed away on Saturday, September 28, 2019, surrounded by her family at Tender Hearts in Dilworth, MN.

Sally was born on January 3, 1934, to Hans and Nettie Haugen in rural LaMoure, ND. She was the next to youngest of seven children.

Sally graduated from LaMoure in 1952 and moved to Fargo and worked for Reinhardt Brothers as a secretary. In 1954, she met Harold Horpedahl, fell in love and married him on June 3, 1955. They built a home on the Horpedahl farm northeast of Dilworth.

Together, Sally and Harold raised five kids. Sally kept busy as a stay at home mom and helping Harold on the farm. Sally was involved in Concordia Church activities, homemakers, birthday club, ladies auxiliary, and 4-H. Sally was a talented seamstress and crocheted and knit many beautiful things! Sally loved working outside all summer long and kept a beautiful yard and many beautiful flowers.

In 2002, Sally had two debilitating strokes that completely changed her life. Harold's health also started to fail so the decision was made to sell the farm and move to Moorhead. With the help of many Home Health angels, family, and friends, Harold took care of Sally there until his death in March of 2018. After Harold's death, Sally moved to Tender Hearts in Dilworth and she was comfortable and happy there.

Sally is survived by her children, Diane (Leo) Murr, Nancy (Dan) Ruud, Steve Horpedahl, Ron (Jamie) Horpedahl, and Sue (Dean Hanson) Sip; grandchildren, Heath (Alyssa), Brandon, McKaila, Adam (Megan), Amanda, Emily, Andy, Aaron, Skylar, Lisa, Tony, and Joseph; greatgranddaughter, Eve Murr; sisters in law, Alice and Ruth; numerous nieces and nephews; and her little companion dog, Maisey.

Sally is preceded in death by her loving husband, Harold; daughter in law, Lorna; parents, Hans and Nettie; sister, Hazel; brothers, Kenneth, Leo, Robert, Ole, and Harvey.

Funeral services and burial were held on Saturday, October 5, 2019 at Concordia.
