At the time of this writing it is the day before Independence Day.

Given that in the email message for this past Sunday I spoke about Freedom from a biblical perspective it seemed appropriate that the voice of Martin Luther be heard on this matter as well. Luther wrote a treatise entitled "The Bondage of the Will" in which he elucidated the Apostle Paul's doctrine of justification. In it he repudiated "works righteousness" saying that not only is there nothing that humans can do to save themselves but even more so that "natural man", that is unredeemed person (non-Christian) can do nothing to save him or herself. Our salvation is not a collaborative effort between God and us but is wholly dependent on God. Luther looked at scripture and the history of Church and came to believe that we were saved by God's grace and only by that grace. In his work "The Bondage of the Will", he provides the biblical rational for the thesis that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves. This sounds like a negative title for book, but the concept is what secures our total dependency on Christ for our righteousness before a perfect God. Luther compares "self righteousness", where we take partial credit for our right relationship with God, to "alien righteousness", where we acknowledge that our right relationship with God has

nothing to do with us but only with God. It is a righteousness that comes not from within but from without.

A later work of Luther's was entitled, "The Freedom of a Christian" (1520 AD). In it Luther states that now that God has done it all for us through Christ and now that we have nothing to do to secure our salvation, we have "everything to do". God has liberated us from Sin, death and the powers of darkness in order that we may pass that gift on to others both through word and deed. This is not done to earn God's favor or even to pay him back. We serve our neighbor not out of guilt, shame or a sense of indebtedness but out of gratitude for what God has done for us. We don't love our neighbor as we love ourselves for any other reason than we want to. Having experienced the most perfect love and self-sacrifice of what Jesus did for us on the cross and empty tomb, we spontaneously pay it forward to those that we encounter. The Apostle Paul stated that for freedom Christ has set us free. Luther rephrased that by saying, "A Christian is perfectly a free lord of all people, subject to no one (but God). A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject to all." ((The Freedom of a Christian)).

We have been blessed to be born into a country that while flawed, had great (and flawed) founders that crafted the Constitution and Bill of Rights that along with God's grace, created the rock solid foundation for the building of our republic. God has showered his favor on us through Christ and through being born into the United States of America. Let us live our lives so that all Americans would experience release from bondage not just of the will but any bondage that would prevent all our fellow citizens from fully experiencing the freedom that is inherent in the gospel and the freedom which is due to all who live in our great land. God bless America and God bless you and yours this Independence Day weekend.



Recipe of the Month Southwest Pasta Salad

Ingredients

kosher salt

- 1 lb. dry bow tie pasta (or your choice)
- 1 15-oz. can corn kernels
- 1 c. shredded cheddar
- 2 avocados, diced

For the dressing

- 1 c. Greek yogurt
- 1 tbsp. honey
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 jalapeño, chopped

kosher salt

1 15-oz. can black beans

- 1 c. halved cherry tomatoes
- 1/3 c. chopped cilantro
- 1/3 c. extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 tbsp. apple cider vinegar
- 2 limes, juiced
- 1 1/2 tbsp. taco seasoning

Directions

- In a large pot of salted boiling water, cook pasta according to package directions until al dente. Drain and and cool, 5 minutes.
- Dressing: Mix ingredients. Taste and add salt as desired.
- Stir corn, black beans, cheese, tomatoes, avocados and cilantro in with pasta. Toss with dressing. Cover tightly and refrigerate 1 hour before serving.



Red River Girl

A book from Norway about the Buffalo River Settlement

as told by Orabel Thortvedt



The West Telemark Museum in Norway is sponsoring an exhibit about the Buffalo River Settlement from June 15. 2020 September 15. 2021. A group from

West Telemark visited Moorhead a couple of years ago to gather information and review Orabel's scrapbooks to glean information for the exhibit. From their website:

The history of the *Buffalo River* settlement - all the way up north in Minnesota, not far from the double town of Fargo / Moorhead - is legendary since 1909, when Torkel Oftelie mentioned it in the first issue of *Telesoga*. Central to this story is the Geitestad (later Thortvedt) family from Fyresdal who emigrated to the Midwest in 1861. After nearly 10 years in Houston County, they began the legendary *Red River Trek* - a pioneering walk to the undeveloped plains between the Red River and Buffalo River, where they settled in 1870. History is documented by the artist Orabel Thortvedt (1896-1983) through numerous paintings, drawings and scrapbooks. It is this material the story is told through, both in the exhibition and as a magnificent book.

The book, "Red River Girl" has been published in Norway and tells the story both in Norwegian and in English. It will be available in the US through Telelaget, the organization of descendants of immigrants from Telemark. Filled with photos and Orabel's sketches, it offers the story of the journey to Clay County and the early years of the settlement on the Buffalo along with biographical information about Orabel herself.

A copy will be donated to Concordia Church for those of you who would like to take a look at it. It is indeed a "magnificent book" - hardcover, roughly 9" X 13", art silk paper, a true "coffee table book." It would be a great addition to your personal library, and would make a great gift for anyone interested in the history of the Buffalo River Settlement.

The book's arrival in the US is scheduled for August of this year. When it is available, ordering information will be included in *Concordia News*.
